#### DATA Welcomes New Trail Administrator

## **Trail Conditions Update**

The team at DATA and a group of volunteers cleared the trails and repaired equipment with record speed in December. Thank you to everyone who helped and continue to make the trails safe.

With the recent snow, we've been getting lots of questions regarding grooming the trails. We have four groomers on the trail and most trails are open. There are some areas with open fields that are not being groomed due to the lack of snow. If you come to a gate that is closed, do not open the gate...turn around. The landowners have requested if the trail isn't being groomed to keep the gates closed.

# Grant-In-Aid Funding Update

We've received an update on snowmobile funding at the recent MnUSA Rendezvous. Unfortunately, it is not good news.

As many of you are aware, a large part of the funding to cover the costs associated with grooming and maintaining snowmobile trails in Minnesota comes from Grant-In-Aid funding. With a brown year last year and light snow this year, snowmobile registrations are down, which means funding is limited.

The word received is the first payment of 2025 funding will be sent. We can submit for the second payment but it will be held until further funding review. The remaining payments will most likely be eliminated and 2026 funding will be reduced by at least 40% or not be available at all.

Federal equipment and trail repair grants are being delayed by six months.

The DATA board of directors will be reviewing options to ensure the trail system in Douglas County continues to be funded.

You can help by sponsoring a trail for \$100 per mile of trail, by joining or renewing your membership with DATA and MnUSA, and by visiting the Depot Smokehouse and Tavern in Alexandria and participating in the charitable gambling opportunities offered at this location. The Depot is our charitable gambling site and they offer easy access from the Central Lakes Trail along with many food and beverage options.
