## **Definition of a Snowmobile**

There has been a bit of discussion lately about what is the definition of a snowmobile and can the Grant-In-Aid Trails be used by modified "vehicles." Here is what the state says is the definition of a snowmobile.

As per 2023 Minnesota Statues, 84.81 Definitions, Subdivision 3. Snowmobile. "Snowmobile" means a self-propelled vehicle originally manufactured and designed for travel on snow or ice steered by skis or runners. <u>Snowmobile does not include the</u> <u>following vehicles equipped with aftermarket ski</u> and track configurations:

(1) an all-terrain vehicle defined in section 84.92;"All-terrain vehicle" or "vehicle" means a motorized vehicle with: (1) not less than three, but not more than six low pressure or nonpneumatic tires; (2) a total dry weight of 2,000 pounds or less; and (3) a total width from outside of tire rim to outside of tire rim that is 65 inches or less. All-terrain vehicle includes a class 1 allterrain vehicle and class 2 all-terrain vehicle.

(2) an off-highway motorcycle defined in section 84.787; (a) "Off-highway motorcycle" means a motorized, off-highway vehicle traveling on two wheels and having a seat or saddle designed to be straddled by the operator and handlebars for steering control, including a vehicle that is registered under chapter 168 for highway use if it is also used for off-highway operation on trails or unimproved terrain.

## **Definition of a Snowmobile (co**ntinued)

(3) an off-road vehicle defined in section 84.797; (a) "Off-road vehicle" or "vehicle" means a motor-driven recreational vehicle capable of cross-country travel on natural terrain without benefit of a road or trail.

(4) a mini truck defined in section 169.011; (a) "Mini truck" means a motor vehicle that has four wheels; is propelled by an electric motor with a rated power of 7,500 watts or less or an internal combustion engine with a piston displacement capacity of 660 cubic centimeters or less; has a total dry weight of 900 to 2,200 pounds; contains an enclosed cabin and a seat for the vehicle operator; commonly resembles a pickup truck or van, including a cargo area or bed located at the rear of the vehicle; and was not originally manufactured to meet federal motor vehicle safety standards required of motor vehicles in the Code of Federal Regulations, title 49, sections 571.101 to 571.404, and successor requirements.

(5) a utility task vehicle described in section 169.045; a utility task vehicle means a sideby-side, four-wheel drive, off-road vehicle that has four wheels, is propelled by an internal combustion engine with a piston displacement capacity of 1,200 cubic centimeters or less, and has a total dry weight of 1,800 but less than 2,600 pounds. Or

(6) any other vehicle being operated off road.
